


- Overseas and military voter ballots April 8
- Last day to register to vote May 23
- Start of conditional voter registration May 24
- Opening of select Vote Centers May 28
- Opening of all Vote Centers June 4
- Last day to vote/ballots centrally counted June 7
- Last day for USPS to deliver ballots postmarked by Election Day June 14
- Certification of election results, on or before July 7

- 181 Vote Centers open for 4-Days
 Open from June 4 June 7
- 120 Ballot Drop Boxes open 24/7
 Open from May 9 June 7


- No footage that would jeopardize a voter's right to cast a private ballot




- Every voter will have at least one change to a district

Security and Integrity Measures



- Electronic check-in with real-time updates
- Controlled chain of custody
- Command Center
- Rapid deployment teams
- Partnership Law enforcement & District Attorney's office
- Partnership Department of Homeland Security

Security and Integrity Measures



- All votes are cast on paper ballots
- Vote tally system is not connected to the internet
- Pre-election & post-election Logic and Accuracy tests
- 1% Manual Tally
- Risk Limiting Audit (RLA)
- Pre-election & post-election software version confirmation with SOS

Security and Integrity Measures



- Made of military grade metal
- Most locations have camera coverage
- Ballot pick-up (teams of 2)
- Daily randomized routes, chain of custody, GPS tracking, radio communication



Ballot Drop Box Pilot Program



- At select drop boxes
- Secure barcode scanner
- Additional tracking capabilities
