Proponents serve each Recallee with a copy of the Notice of Intention in person or by certified mail. [§11020-11021]

#### **PUBLISH**

Proponents must publish or post the Notice of Intention. [§11022]

#### **REVIEW PROCESS**

R.O.V. notifies proponents within 10 days of filing if the petition format adheres to statute. [§11042]

## 2 OFFICIALS

#### **FILE INTENTION**

Original Notice of Intent must be filed with R.O.V. within 7 days of serving Recallee. [§11021]

#### ANSWER

Recallee may file answer (200 words or less) with R.O.V. and proponents within 7 days of filing Notice of Intention.

#### FILE PUBLICATION

Proof of publication of the Notice of Inte blank petitions must be filed with the R.O.V. [§11042]

#### **APPROVAL**

The required number of signatures and the length of circulation is stipulated by code. If petition meets code, signature gathering process begins.
[§11220-11222]

#### **FILE PETITION**

Proponents file petition with the R.O.V.

#### **VERIFICATION**

Signatures are verified, typically using Statistical Random Sampling. [§11222-11226]

#### **PRIMA FACIE**

If, on the face, the number of signatures fulfill the minimum number required, the petition is filed. [§11222]

#### RECALL ELECTION

If, after verification, the valid signatures are greater than the requirements, the petition is given to the Recallee's board, and a recall election is scheduled. [§11222, §11227]
