CEW Bylaws



Article II. Organization

Section 2. The Chair and Vice Chair shall be elected from the general membership (with the exception of representatives of political parties) and shall serve for the period of one year. The term of service for the Chair and Vice Chair shall commence on the first work day in January and terminate on the last work day in December. Election of the Chair and Vice Chair shall be held annually during the last first Working Group meeting of each calendar year by majority vote. The Registrar of Voters shall select the Secretary from the Registrar of Voters staff.



Article IV. Meetings and Actions

Section 1. Meetings.

Regular meetings will be held two to four times a year. As may be necessary, the Registrar of Voters will call for special meetings to act upon immediate concerns.

 Meetings are to be held at the office of the Registrar of Voters, 1300 S. Grand Avenue, Santa Ana, California- and/or online using an audio and video conferencing application.



Article IV. Meetings and Actions

Section 2. Parliamentary Authority. The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rosenberg's Rules of Order: Newly Revised Simple Rules of Parliamentary Procedure for the 21st Century shall govern the working group in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these bylaws and any special rules of order the working group may adopt.

November 2022 General – Election Recap



- 1.8M ballots mailed to registered voters
- 181 Vote Centers, including 31 with Drive-Thru Drop Off Service
- 121 Ballot Drop Boxes
- 6 Pop-Up Voting Locations
- Enhanced Outreach and Observation Programs




November 2022 General – Turnout

- 1,817,149 registered voters
- 54.7% voter turnout
- 994,227 ballots cast
 - 830,162 ballots cast by mail
 - 164,065 ballots cast in person






November 2022 General – Overall Turnout






November 2022 General – VBM Return Method

November 2022 General Election - Accessibility

- 67 curbside voting requests
- 36,273 ballots returned via Drive-Thru Ballot Drop-Off
- 1,041 voters accessed the RAVBM system
- 870 cast ballot using RAVBM

Preparing for the 2024 Elections




- VCA requires Vote Centers to be open for 8 hours during the first 10 days
 - OC has exceeded the requirement:
 - 9 hours for first 7 days
 - 12 hours for next 3 days
 - Neighboring counties during first 10 days
 - San Diego 9 hours, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.
 - Riverside 8 hours, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.
 - Los Angeles 9 hours, 10 a.m. to 7 p.m.




Vote Center Turnout Trends
